Topline Report – May 20, 2016

Clout Research conducted a telephone survey of likely primary election voters in Oklahoma House District 36. The survey was conducted May 16-19, 2016, and included 247 respondents by landline telephone. The survey carries a confidence interval of 95% and a margin of error of +/- 6.22 %.

Question 1. There is a primary election coming up in June in which we will choose our party's nominees for several public offices. How likely are you to vote in that upcoming primary election?
