

# Survey of Likely Republican Primary Voters in OK HD 50

*Topline Report – May 20, 2016*

Clout Research conducted a telephone survey of likely Republican primary voters in Oklahoma House District 50. The survey was conducted May 16-19, 2016, and included 262 respondents by landline telephone. The survey carries a confidence interval of 95% and a margin of error of +/- 6.04%.
